<p>Definition. A product, other than real property, that is of a type customarily used by the general public or by nongovernmental entities for purposes other than governmental purposes.</p> <p>For example Commercial Item Automatic Direction Finder Antenna (ADF) the version of this antenna used on Blackhawk helicopters is of a size and shape not used by other helicopters however there are several vendors that do sell ADF antennas in <u>substantial quantities for the same purpose</u>. After comparing these it was determined the ADF antenna is commercial even though the exact same antenna is not sold to other than the USG.</p>

CATEGORY: (2) COMMERCIAL EVOLVED		
<p>Definition. A product that evolved from a product described in category (1) of this definition through advances in technology or performance and that is not yet available in the commercial marketplace, but will be available in the commercial marketplace in time to satisfy the delivery requirements under a Government solicitation.</p> <p>Examples of a Product that has evolved are: Software (Word 2013, Word 2016, etc.) this product has evolved due to technology improvements onto a next version, it is available to any industry other than the USG (general public), other examples are: heavy trucks, construction vehicles, surveillance systems, integrated circuits, battery cells, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). Key words: upgrade, new version.</p>

CATEGORY: (3) COMMERCIAL WITH MODIFICATIONS		
<p>Definition. A product that would satisfy a criterion expressed in paragraph (1) or (2) of this definition, except for-</p> <p>(i) Modifications of a type customarily available in the commercial marketplace; or</p> <p>(ii) Minor modifications of a type not customarily available in the commercial marketplace made to meet Federal Government requirements. “Minor modifications” means modifications that do not significantly alter the nongovernmental function or essential physical characteristics of an item or component, or change the purpose of a process. Factors to be considered in determining whether a modification is minor include the value and size of the modification and the comparative value and size of the final product. Dollar values and percentages may be used as guideposts, but are not conclusive evidence that a modification is minor.</p>

Installation services, maintenance services, repair services, training services, and other services if-</p> <p>(i)Such services are procured for support of a commercial product as defined in this section, regardless of whether such services are provided by the same source or at the same time as the commercial product; and</p> <p>(ii)The source of such services provides similar services contemporaneously to the general public under terms and conditions similar to those offered to the Federal Government;</p> <p>Services of a type offered and sold competitively in substantial quantities in the commercial marketplace based on established catalog or market prices for specific tasks performed or specific outcomes to be achieved and under standard commercial terms and conditions.</p>
